

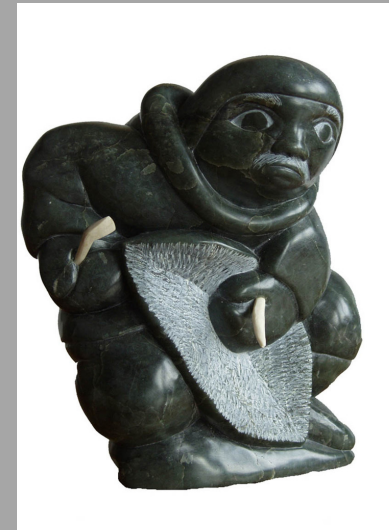


Lucassie Echalook

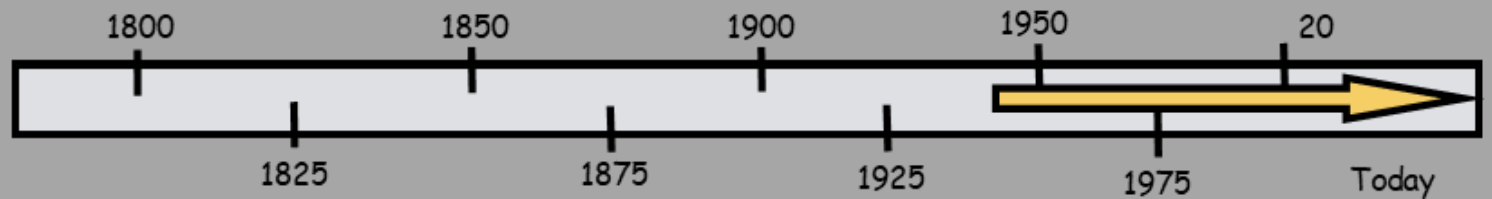
Lucassie Echalook was born in 1942 in a small hunting camp near Inukjuak. He learned to carve after his father's death by observing Peter, Thomassie Echalook's brother. Lucassie was mostly a carver, but he has also made some prints that were included in the 1975 Arctic Quebec Print catalogue. In the past, his main theme was hunting scenes, but his later work includes spirits and shamanic transformations. His work has appeared in exhibitions around the world: North America, France and Korea. His work is also included in collections at museums and galleries across Canada.
