


Piqalujait studio: Photo Studio in Ivujivik Project highlights • **Piqalujait Studio** is a photo studio that is was done as a joint project between Cycle 2 students in French and English.

• Piqalujait Studio has 2 streams: (1) providing photography services to the community, as well as selling greeting cards and frames with pictures from the community, and (2) producing and recording Elders stories

 Piiqalujait Studio hosted several community photoshoot events in (ie. photo booths at the Christmas Bazaar and for Valentine's Day). They were also awarded the school contract for student photos.

• Students were **involved in every aspect of the business** setting prices, purchasing inventory, finding suppliers etc and developed real business managements skills over the course of the semester.





- Over the semester, students **developed a new level of confidence** to talk live on the radio, even in between songs to make for smoother transitions.










# Oanniit: Print Making in Ivujivik Project highlights

#### Qanniit makes culture-inspired prints that they turn into various products.

- They started by creating prints for greeting cards, and with the same prints, they also created new products like bags and apparel. They also make jewellery.
- Qanniit have sold their products at Tivi and are looking for more distributors. They also have an active instagram account and are getting requests from people from all over for their products.



## Tackling Climate Change in Kangirsuk Project highlights

• The project started with elder interviews and a berry picking outing. This series of interviews and land expeditions helped students to better understand climate challenges in connection with Inuit land knowledge and wisdom

• Students watched climate change documentaries, which sparked a passion about climate change.

 Students created a greenhouse in the classroom in response to the climate change challenge, growing different types of plants and learning from trial and error.



### Building up local tourism infrastructure in Kangiqsujuaq Project highlights

 In Kangiqsujuaq, a popular tourist destination in Nunavik, CCD students worked on the concept for a local tourism business in partnership with local organizations, offering various packages.

 Students participated in many land expeditions, local business visits, cultural activities, and interviews with local elders.

• Other smaller projects included **building a compost bin for the NV out of wood pallets** and planning the set-up of a visitors centre where they would host visitors for tea, information, etc.
